BUILDING PROJECT

Next week sees the commencement of a major building project that will have a profound impact on certain areas of the functioning of the College. The project will eventually result in a vastly improved Theatre and Drama Complex, and will certainly prove to be worth the inconveniences experienced in the months ahead. At Tuesday's assembly I reminded the girls that this will not be the first period of building-related inconvenience experienced by the College. An example of this is the fact that in order to facilitate the extensive improvements to our dining room facilities that were completed in 2009, meals had to be served in what is now our Indoor Centre. I am confident that, as has proven to be the case in the past, resilience on the part of all will enable us to deal with the challenges that will come our way in the next nine (?) months.

In this connection, I need to bring to your attention two changes that will impact on motorists travelling on our campus.

- Motorists travelling on the road around the College will have to exit using the gate opposite the Science Centre and travel down Church Lane which runs perpendicularly to Hilton Avenue. This gate will have a guard permanently stationed at it who, amongst other duties, will control the portable biometric machine that records the girls' departure from the campus. The girls will have received information about relevant changes to the "clocking in procedure".
- There will be a need for a limited number of pedestrians to use part of the road in the vicinity of the Science Centre. A yellow pedestrian line, similar to the one next to the Music Centre, has been painted. Motorists are requested to exercise particular care in this area and to avoid cutting across this line.
